Description of Problem: The residents at the west end of Juergens Ave have been complaining about juveniles trespassing on private property. This is occurring while they are playing in the street. They usually play football and hit cars with the football and trespass on private property when the ball goes into yards.

There are also complaints of open air drug sales from the same residents. The residents feel that this complaint is supported by the flow of traffic from Vine St. through to Clifton Ave. There has been an increase in traffic during the late evening hours. Residents state that vehicles come into the neighborhood from Vine St. and stop in the 100 block of Juergens Ave. They stay at this location for a few minutes, and then leave the neighborhood by way of Green Hill Ave. to Clifton Ave.

Phase of SARA: Response

## **SARA Documentation**

Scanning (state problem): There are actually two problems here. The first problem is juveniles that are trespassing on private property. These juveniles reside at 102 Juergens Ave.

The other complaint is of drug sales that originate from 106 Juergens Ave. This property also is in disrepair and is not owner occupied. The owner's nephew uses this property as a part time residence. The owner of this residence is Mary Hopkins, and the part time resident is Terry Larkins.

Analysis (identify factual support): During the period from January 1, 2006 through May 26, 2006 there were 24 calls for service in the 100 Block of Juergens Ave. There was only one call for Drug Complaint and one call for Juvenile Complaint. On May 26, 2006, the Form 305 was completed and assigned to the relief. Since that time to the present, there have been only 10 calls for service. One was a Drug Complaint and six were Noise Complaints. The calls for service have decreased, but a disturbing trend was discovered. The majority of calls for service were to 102 Juergens Ave. (60%) The next step will be to address the issues that are generating calls for service to this address. The majority of calls are Noise Complaints. After communicating via email with some residents on the street, we may be able to enforce some Neighborhood Quality of Life Codes at this location.

Response (define action taken): Officer Keuper completed a Form 305 for Juergens Ave. The request covers the 100 block of Juergens Ave and was submitted and assigned to Second Relief, Third Relief and the Investigative Unit, on May 26, 2006. This Directed Patrol was carried out from May 26, 2006, through July 4, 2006. During this time, there was no criminal activity observed or reported.

The calls for service have ceased, and the activity in the neighborhood has slowed down dramatically. Aside from a few complaints of noise in this area, the resident at 106 Juergens Ave. has been taking care of the property, cutting the grass and not allowing people to loiter in front of this property. Complaints from the neighbors around this address via email to Officer Keuper have

stopped. There has been a request for statistics relative to calls for service and crime statistics submitted to the District Crime Analyst. When those statistics are received, I will close out this CPOP case.
