Description of Problem: Loud and Disorderly Juveniles

Phase of SARA: Assessment

## **SARA Documentation**

Scanning (state problem): Citizens are complaining of juveniles loitering in Hawaiian Terrace being loud and disorderly between the hours of 2200 and 0200 hours. This is causing many problems for the residents in this area.

Analysis (identify factual support): Calls for service, citizens complaints, crime analysis data, incident reports and personal observation appear to substantiate this perception.

Since June 8, 2006 there have been 50 calls for service on Hawaiian Terrace for various complaints including 14 disorderly runs, 10 juvenile complaints, 19 noise runs, 1 Breaking and Entering, 1 Robbery and 5 crowd complaints.

Response (define action taken): A CPOP team has been formed to address the problem. The District Five VCS, beat officers, Community Response Team and Street Corner Units targeted this area for enforcement. Enforcement efforts included uniform walking patrols, bicycle patrols and covert operations. A large number of directed patrols have been done in this area resulting in several arrest. In addition, the Citizens on Patrol and Neighborhood Watch program were implemented

Assessment (document measurement): The increased patrols and the detail officer have reduced the number service calls to Hawaiian Terrace. From June to October we have had a total of 74 radio runs for Disorderly Group (4 or More), Disorderly Person (Includes Crowd), Fight in Progress, Noise Complaint, Juvenile Complaint as compared to 78 radio runs from January to May. I also believe the implementation of Citizens on Patrol and a Neighborhood Watch program will help reduce the number of radio runs and disorderly activity even further.
